Docked at Hong Kong at 8⁰⁰ a.m. Went to

Repulse Bay Hotel. One large room for the three of us. 40⁰⁰ Mex per day. Exchange rate = 3.20 Mex for \$1⁰⁰ American. Scheduled to leave here at 9⁰⁰ pm.

will appreciate prompt telegraphic

Congressional Record

July 24. —

Received night letter (cable) from Col. Harry (1.68) and immediately repeated the gist of it to Signal Officer, San Francisco, asking him to radio my message to C. G. P. and Dept for Gen. MacArthur (1.35)

My message informed Gen. Mac A. that we would probably get some F-1 on Ft. Mason equip. on the way. I tip-toed that Col. Harry could make no prophecy as to November possibilities.

Wire from Lee suggests conference at Whitehead next Thurs or Friday — which is O.K.

— July 27 — Thurs.

Last eve sent Gen. Mac A. cipher letter enclosing a message from Col. Harry re: Ft. Mason situation. Unreceipted till 10 stamp 50

This morning am taking F-1 to Whitehead, Krocus to talk to Sherman & Bealecraft people.
