9:30 this sorning with reference to a story carried by both AP and UP that the Pope had intervened in the Resemberg case. The Secretary checked with the staff in his office, who had just convened for the regular secting, and told him that we had not received any communication from the Vatican on the matter.

Mr. Hagerty asked the Secretary's advice as to what he could say at his 10:30 Press Conference and the Secretary suggested that he say that neither the White House nor the State Department had any knowledge of the matter except for the press report and nothing could be said about it.

Both stories stresped that the Pope had made the appeal "some time before the President encursed his decision".
