Dear Toy:

I refer to previous letters from Coorge West and myself concerning LIVE OWK, the last communication in this estegory being my letter of June 23.

On August 5, General Borstad sont forward to the Chiefs of Staff of the Triportite Covernments the revised LIVE OAK Plancing Group paper on "More Blaborate Military Mossures", with which he stated his agreement. For your information, he decided to give his approval to this paper only after considerable soul-searching since, in fact, he considers it as only partly responsive to his critical comment on the first draft. He told me in confidence that he let this latest study go forward because (1) it was obvious that the British were not going to budge from their restrictive approach to the problem, and (2) he felt that his own rises had been effectively put on the record in his written reaction to the first draft. I imagine he may wall have been notivated also by the fact that given the present turn of events on the international seems, the LIVE OAK planning effort is not destined to get much attention from governments in the months impediately absed.

I would necess that those in the Department who are charged with this matter have by now received a copy of this third LTVS OVE study. Though I am told by Dick Fina at BUCCH that the American military planaers who participated in the study were still unhappy about the final version, I believe that everyone agrees that it is an improvement over the first draft. I would say that the final paper recognizes that local military activity in the Borlin access area, while in itself inniequate to have a decisive effect on the Soviets.

could be an indispensable factor in forcing the Seviete to realize that we seem business and thereby to provide circustances in which negotiations with them might prove fruitful. In other words, it is recognised in the planning document that a limited ground force, tacked by the threat of meelear war, would compel the Seviete to face the unmistable immissions of general war should they persist in obstructing the access to Berlin. There is also an interpeting section in the study on the possibilities of encouraging a revolt in East Germany so timed as to dater the Seviete from initiating general war.

Though the U.S. planners attempted to eliminate it, there respin to the study vestiges of a British-introduced assumption that our rights of access to Berlin relate only to the physical means themselves and that, for example, there would be a distinction between a Tripartite military movement restricted to the Autobalm per so as against, let us say, a trespens by such a military column on the area just adjacent to the Autobalm. In the latter case, "East German covereignty" is said to be involved and the Vareaw Part would be invoked. I don't for a minute believe that the responsible British policy makers are so legally and politically confused as this one indicates; rether it is a matter of putting wraps on the already stolid imaginations of the military planners.

It may interest you that although the LIVE OAK project has been technically maintained on its original non-HiTO basis, a number of SHAPE officers of British, French and American nationality have been drawn into the effort recently. For example, Brigadier Cardiff, the head of Public Information Division, is now wearing a hat as a LIVE OAK planner on the public information side. British and French officers at SHAPE played the most important rule in Moratad's massage to the Chairman of the JUS, which was the subject of Embed 118. Horstad also used some of the American officer personnel at SHAPE to firm up the language in the final version of the "Massa Blaborate Military Heasures" paper. As you probably know, JUS was informed in CINCEUM EC 9 10915 of July 13 that the Germans were being out in on the LIVE OAK planning through the German Mational Military Representative at SHAPE.

One last matter. In late June, General Paget, a French officer at SHAPE, recommended to General Harvised that he sauk to obtain from the Borth Atlantic Council extherity in advance

to put into effect NATO military alerts in appropriate phasing with whatever alerts the Tripartite powers might adopt in the light of Berlin developments. Though General Norstad never took a final position on this recommendation, I believe he would recommend that at such time as the three governments "consult the NATO Council before initiating a probe" (JCS message 962347 of July 14 to CINCEUR), they should request the Council to give the NATO military authorities this discretionary power regarding alerts.

As stated at the outset, there is some question as to how lively LIVE OAK will be in the coming months, so this is likely to be the last informal report in this series for some time. I am going on home leave in mid-September, but during my absence George Vest here at SHAPE and Dick Finn at EUCOM will continue to give this project appropriate attention.
