## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of microfilm copies of newspaper clippings from the Library of The Kansas City Star and Times relating to Dwight D. Eisenhower.

The clippings were arranged into three series. The first two, the chronological and subject-alphabetical files, were received in 1967. A subsequent series of clippings relating to President Eisenhower death and funeral services was received in 1969. All clippings in the first two series were collected in numbered envelopes. The chronological clippings list the article dates and headlines. The subject-alphabetical clippings list the subject of all clippings within the envelope.
