SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

James C. Canole graduated from the University of Kansas' School of Engineering and Architecture in 1949. Kansas Governor John A. Anderson appointed Canole to the position of State Architect in 1961. As State Architect, Canole designed the Place of Meditation on the grounds of the Dwight D. Eisenhower Presidential Library and Museum. The construction of the Place of Meditation began in the summer of 1965 and was completed in the spring of 1966.

This collection consists primarily of the personal memoirs of James C. Canole entitled *Eisenhower Place of Meditation: a Recount by Head Architect James Canole*. The memoir details Canole's involvement with various projects relating not only to the construction of the Place of Meditation, but also to other projects involving the Eisenhower Presidential Library and Museum. The individual chapters following the introduction are named for their respective subjects:
