1967 SIGNATURE FILE

Series Description

The Signature File contains materials similar to documents in the 1967 Principal File. The first subseries is divided into categories identical to some of those found in the Principal File, and the second subseries is an alphabetical file. The difference between the Signature File and the Principal File is that all of Eisenhower's correspondence with prominent individuals is in the Principal File or the Special Names Series, and the Signature File contains primarily routine correspondence which was handled by the Gettysburg office staff.

The first subseries is a subject file. It contains such categories as gifts received, invitations, medals and awards, memberships, messages, and public relations. Gifts received and autograph requests are the two biggest categories. There are about three and a half boxes of materials relating to gifts received, and items sent to the former President include books, calendars, posters, prints, photographs, and miscellaneous objects.

Eisenhower's staff wrote hundreds of letters acknowledging gifts of books, articles, clippings, photographs, scrapbooks, posters, sheet music, periodicals, and pamphlets. Interesting historic items given to Eisenhower include an autograph book kept by a student at Lane University in 1887, 1952 campaign sheet music, an original 1918 Tank Corps promotion certificate signed by Captain D.D. Eisenhower, the original journal of a Civil War soldier, 1862-63, and an original letter by another Civil War soldier.

Another item of interest in this subseries is the summary or report of an interview of the expresident by students from the Adult Division of Whittier Union High School. During this interview Eisenhower responded to questions concerning General Charles de Gaulle, Vietnam, U.S. commitments, changes in history, World Communism, advice for future presidents, and possible Republican candidates for president in 1968.

The second subseries is a three-box alphabetical file. It is organized alphabetically by the names of individuals and organizations writing to Eisenhower. There is virtually no correspondence or comments by Eisenhower in this subseries on substantive issues. A sizeable portion of the documents in this subseries are cross reference sheets to correspondence filed in the first subseries. There are a few articles and newspaper clippings with information on Eisenhower or issues in the 1950s and 1960s, and these may be of some interest to researchers. This file also has a number of interesting and colorful handmade birthday and get-well cards from children and adults.

The 1967 Signature File documents some of the routine correspondence handled by Eisenhower's office staff. The bulk of the material deals with administrative matters, such as gifts, autographs, and memberships. A few interesting, historic items, including the Civil War journal and letter, were sent to Eisenhower. The volume of correspondence, home-made greeting

cards, gifts, and autograph requests indicate that many Americans continued to have an interest in and affection for the former president.

There are no classified or closed documents in this series. Original copies of the Civil War letter and journal, as well the 1918 certificate signed by Eisenhower, have been removed from the files for preservation reasons and replaced with copies. Sixteen items have been transferred to the museum, and sixty-seven photographs have been sent to the Audiovisual Collection. Thirty-eight printed items, including books, booklets, and periodicals, have been transferred to the Book Collection.
