EISENHOWER, DWIGHT D.: Records as President, White House Central Files, 1953-61

Pre-Inaugural Files of Dwight D. Eisenhower, July 1952- January 1953*

Pre-Accession

This file may be generally described as a file of Dwight D. Eisenhower's campaign headquarters. It was received at the Library with the White House Central Files in 1961. This file was kept in storage by Central Files in the White House, Room 98, during President Eisenhower's Administration. Many of President Eisenhower's papers dated during the period of July 1952 to January 1953 were removed from this file and from other sources and were interfiled by White House personnel in the White House Central Files as part of the Official File, General File, and President's Personal File (Although such documents may be filed under any code in Central Files, see especially the following general code series: OF 138, GF 109 and PPF 49). Additionally, some 1952 papers may be found in other files, such as the Files of Mrs. Ann Whitman, Personal Secretary to the President. The criteria used for filing 1952 papers in the Pre-Inaugural Files, rather than in other files, could not be determined.

<u>Eisenhower, 1960-61</u>, pp. 348-352. Papers falling into the categories of paragraph 7 of that letter have been removed at this time. Approximately 9% of the records in this file have been thus closed to research.

* Included in the file are a few letters sent to or by General Eisenhower during 1951, and from January thru June 1952; and card entries in February 1953.

The "Geographical Series" of this file is the most important of the three series. The series is arranged alphabetically by state and thereunder alphabetically by name of correspondent. The greater part consists of material pertaining to the campaign of Dwight D. Eisenhower for the Presidency, from July to November, 1952. Included in this series is material dated between his election on November 4 and his inauguration on January 20, 1953, and a few items dated as early as 1951. There is some correspondence with high ranking political figures in this series that provides significant information concerning the campaign and the issues with which the new Administration would by dealing. Such letters are not clearly separated from public mail, nor are they presently identified by subject. They are likely to be found in this series filed under the names of important political persons. The names of important individuals connected with the 1952 campaign are listed on archivists' research reports and such lists may be used to identify folders in this file likely to contain important information. The bulk of the papers in this series are routine letters from the public and local campaign workers requesting autographs, discussing political issues, inviting General Eisenhower to attend events, and discussing other matters. Most of the correspondence in this series was acknowledged by Edward Green, Assistant to Dwight D. Eisenhower. Some was acknowledged by Dwight D. Eisenhower, or others.

Papers originally filed in this series under Alabama, Arizona and Arkansas were removed prior to receipt of this file by the Library, and filed into Central Files (OF, GF, and PPF).

The "Operation Appreciation Series" of this file consists principally of correspondence pertaining to the project of writing "thank you" letters to campaign workers, including persons who made arrangements for General Eisenhower's appearances. Included also in this series are letters from local campaign workers analyzing the vote or expressing opinions on the outcome of the election. Also included are lists of campaign workers in the various states. There are a few more significant items - they are identified by bracketed annotations on the list of folder titles below.

The "Card Index Series" of this file consists of two indexes. The first is an index of organizations to which General Eisenhower belonged. Entries often indicate when General Eisenhower became a member, type of membership, whether or not he retained membership after becoming President, and the name of the head of the organization. Latest entries are in February 1953, the latest dates in the entire file. The second index is an index to 1952 correspondence. However, the index is of limited usefulness. A check indicated that the correspondence referred to in the index was filed in White House Central Files (OF, GF, and PPF) without regard to the numerical system upon which this index was based (for an analysis of the obsolete numerical system see OF 72-A-13, Haddon to Steffan dated 1/20/53). Such correspondence would be found in Central Files by use of ordinary finding aids applicable to CF, GF, and PPF, with the exception that such correspondence apparently was not cross referenced in Central Files Alpha to the name of correspondent. One possible use of this index would be to determine under which state in the Geographical Series a particular name is filed. For instance, the index indicates that Henry Cabot Lodge was a resident of Massachusetts. The archivist may then proceed to the Massachusetts component in the Geographical Series to find the folder for Henry Cabot Lodge. Cards usually indicate name and address of correspondent, obsolete filing number, type of letter and date of letter.

- Index Series. 1951-February 1953. 5 boxes. 5 x 8 cards. Series consists of 2 indexes. The first is an index of organizations to which Dwight E. Eisenhower belonged. Initial arrangement is alphabetical by name of organization, followed by cards arranged by type of organization. The second index is an obsolete index to correspondence. Arrangement is alphabetical by name of correspondent
