In a letter of gift dated March 10, 1977, Roger Jones declared the collection unrestricted. Documents created by government officials in the performance of their official duties are in the public domain.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Roger W. Jones (1908-1993) was born in New Hartford, Connecticut. He graduated from Cornell University and received a master's degree from Columbia University. In 1933 he moved to Washington, DC, and went to work for the Bureau of the Budget. During the Eisenhower administration Jones served as Assistant Director for Legislative Reference and as Deputy Director of the Bureau. President Eisenhower appointed him chairman of the Civil Service Commission in 1959 where he served until the start of the Kennedy administration. President Kennedy appointed him Deputy Under Secretary of State for Administration. In 1962 Jones returned to the Bureau of the Budget where he served as special assistant to the Director, as Assistant Director, and as a consultant, until he retired in 1975.

This collection consists of a set of Jones's major public speeches and articles that he prepared between 1954 and 1975. A list of the speeches and articles, compiled by Jones's staff, is filed in the first folder. The speeches and articles have been arranged in the same order that they appear on the list, which is roughly chronological. The list gives the date and title of the speeches and articles, which serves as a general guide to the subject matter.

In most of the speeches and articles, Jones confined himself to discussing general government policy matters and did not include much detail on his personal duties. His discussions tend to reflect the positions he held. For example, from 1954 to 1958 when he was Assistant Director for Legislative Reference at the Bureau of the Budget, his speeches and articles mostly discuss the U.S. budget, and the role of the Bureau of the Budget in the legislative process. During 1959 and 1960, when he was Chairman of the Civil Service Commission, Jones concentrated on government personnel programs and civil service matters.

More information on Jones's career is available in an oral history interview that Jones did with Columbia University in 1967. A copy of the interview is available at the Eisenhower Library. A collection of Jones's personal papers, covering his government service after the end of the Eisenhower administration, is at the John F. Kennedy Library in Boston, Massachusetts.
