SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

John William Leonard was born on January 25, 1890 in Toledo, Ohio to Dennis and Anastasia Leonard. He graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1915 and was a classmate of Dwight D. Eisenhower.

Following graduation he served with the 6th Infantry Regiment at Fort Bliss near El Paso, Texas and took part in the chase of Pancho Villa across the Mexican border. The Regiment was assigned to the 5th Infantry Division in November 1917 and moved to Fort Oglethorpe, Georgia for training. It was sent to France where it joined the action (World War I) in July 1918.

Newly promoted to major, Leonard commanded a battalion of the 6th Infantry Regiment during Battle of Saint-Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne Offensive. For his bravery on the battlefield near the village of Romagne-sous-Montfaucon, Major Leonard was promoted to the rank of lieutenant colonel.

Leonard stayed in Europe for occupation duties until October 1921 when he assumed command of the 15th Tank Battalion in Fort Benning, Georgia. From 1923 to 1927 he served in the office of the Chief of Infantry in Washington, DC, attended the advanced infantry course at Fort Benning, and attended the Command and General Staff School at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. From 1928 to 1933 he instructed ROTC cadets at the Pennsylvania Military College in Chester, Pennsylvania.

From 1933 to 1936 Leonard was assigned to the 15th Infantry in Tientsin China. Returning to the US in 1936, he was appointed as an instructor for the Maryland National Guard in Frederick, Maryland. In July 1940 he was appointed as an intelligence officer with the 2nd Infantry Division at Fort Sam Houston, Texas. As part of his duties he traveled to Brazil in October 1941 to survey the defenses of Northeastern Brazil.

In December 1941 Leonard was given command of the 6th Armored Infantry Regiment, which was now a part of the 1st Armored Division at Fort Knox, Kentucky. He served a short tour with Combat Command "A" of the 4th Armored Division and was promoted to brigadier general on June 20, 1942.

Leonard joined the 9th Armored Division at Fort Riley, Kansas in July 1942 and assumed command of the division in September, 1942. On October 27, 1942 he was promoted to the rank of major general. In September 1944 the division was transferred to the England and was immediately ordered to Normandy. The division took part in the Rhineland, Ardennes-Alsace, Central Europe Campaigns under his command. On March 7, 1945 the elements of the division crossed the Ludendorff Bridge at Remagen, Germany, the first Allied troops to cross the Rhine River. At the end of fighting in Europe, the division on occupation duty in Bayreuth, Germany.

Leonard continued as its commander until July 1945 when he became commander of the 20th Armored Division at Camp Cooke, California. He continued in command of the division until it was deactivated in April 1946.

He briefly assumed command of the 2nd Armored Division at Camp Hood, Texas. In July 1946 he was assigned to command Fort Knox and the armored school located there. In 1948 he was appointed Senior Military Attaché in the United Kingdom. In 1950 he was promoted to lieutenant general and commanded both the V Corps and XVIII Airborne Corps at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He retired from the army in 1952.

General Leonard passed away on October 26, 1974.

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

SERIES I: CORRESPONDENCE SERIES, 1908-1972 Boxes 1-3

During World War I Leonard corresponded extensively with his new bride, Eileen, whom he referred to by the affectionate nickname "Peg." Occasionally he would include snippets from letters received, with additional annotations, in his outgoing correspondence. World War II correspondence filed under Eileen Leonard is sometimes addressed to his daughter, Eileen, still living at home. After World War II men who had served under him also sometimes wrote to express their thanks and appreciation. Eileen Foster annotated some items to provide additional context to persons, places or events.

Correspondence is arranged alphabetically by surname of correspondent and chronologically thereunder. This series contains correspondence from family, friends and colleagues spanning the length of Leonard's adult life.

SERIES II: MILITARY CAREER SERIES, 1911-1952 Boxes 4-8

This series spans the length of Leonard's career from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, through World War I, his post-war stations in China and elsewhere, his command of the 9th Armored Division in World War II, and his post-war commands. Almost all files with documents from March 1945 contain information about taking the Ludendorff Bridge across the Rhine River at Remagen, Germany.

Items within the files include orders, records of military units, personnel files, maps and other related documents. This series contains photocopies of documents obtained by Leonard and his family from the National Archives in Washington, DC, the Library of Congress and other archives. This series is arranged chronologically.

SERIES III: RETIREMENT SERIES, 1952-1974 Box 8

This series contains documents relating to Leonard's activities after his retirement from the military in 1952. Items include family correspondence, biographical material, desk calendars, documents relating to reunions of the West Point Class of 1915 and other related material. This series is arranged chronologically.

SERIES IV: FAMILY FILES SERIES, 1974-2006 Box 9-10

This series contains correspondence created or received by family members after General Leonard's death in October 1974. Much of the correspondence is with Leonard's military colleagues, historians or veterans groups and relates to his legacy and career in the army. This
