SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

General LeRoy Lutes was appointed Director of Operations, Headquarters Services of Supply in 1942. In succession he became Acting Chief of Staff, Headquarters, Army Service Forces; Chief of Staff and Deputy to the Commanding General, Army Service Forces; and on January 1, 1946, Commanding General, Army Service Forces. On June 11, 1946, he was assigned to Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's General Staff as Director, Service, Supply and Procurement Division. In 1947 he became Director of Staff of the Munitions Board and in 1949 he was made Commanding General of the Fourth Army. He retired from the Army in 1952. In 1955 he was appointed to a committee to advise the Office of Defense Mobilization on the availability of commodities related to national defense.

This collection contains two series.

Series 1 Microfilm of 1941 Louisiana Maneuver Records

This series consist of microfilm of records relating to the Louisiana Maneuvers: maneuver instructions, journals, dispatches, memoranda, correspondence, orders, lists, and other material pertaining to the army's Louisiana maneuvers in 1941. Supply and procurement matters are prevalent, but also included are plans for operations, strength reports and other matters re the maneuvers. Lutes was then a Lt. Colonel and Assistant Chief of Staff, G-4, 3rd Army.

Series 2 Scrapbooks and Miscellaneous Materials

This series consists of photocopies of Lutes' scrapbooks, 1941-67, memoranda, letters, citations, press releases, news clippings and other material covering the military career and life of Lt. General Lutes. Subject matter includes military logistics, stockpiling strategic materials, the oil industry as related to national security, and redeployment after the end of the European war.

Troop Directory, Third Army

[Station lists, strength reports, directions, etc., of units assigned and attached to Third Army, May-August, 1941.]

Lt. Col. LeRoy Lutes Personal File, Nov. 27, 1940-Oct. 21, 1941

[Letters sent and received, orders, memoranda, relating to the maneuvers, their preparations, and termination, in reverse chronological order. The121 papers in this file are listed at the beginning of the folder.]
