SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Thomas C. Mann, a diplomat who specialized in Latin American affairs, worked for the U.S. Department of State from 1942 to 1966. During the first Eisenhower administration he served in a variety of posts, including two years as Ambassador to El Salvador. In late September 1957 Mann moved to Washington, DC, to become Assistant Secretary of State for Economic Affairs. In August 1960 he became Assistant Secretary of State for Inter-American Affairs where he remained until the end of the administration. President Kennedy appointed Mann Ambassador to Mexico where he successfully negotiated a settlement of a boundary dispute between Mexico and the U.S. He later served in Panama during a period of intense anti-U.S. agitation. He resigned from the State Department in 1966 to return to private life.

In 1988 Mann donated his personal papers to Baylor University in Waco, Texas. The Mann collection at Baylor pertains mostly to the Kennedy and Johnson administrations, although a few scattered files date from the Eisenhower administration. Baylor University provided electrostatic copies of these files to the Eisenhower Library in April 1992.

This collection consists of the material received from Baylor University. The bulk of the collection consists of a Chron File containing copies of letters and memoranda written by Mann from October 1957 to January 1961 while serving as Assistant Secretary of State. The material concentrates on Latin American and economic matters. Of particular importance are references to international airline routes, foreign aid programs, and specific commodities such as oil, coffee and sugar.

The Chron File is not complete. Cross references in the file indicate that a separate file once existed which contained documents classified Secret. This Secret Chron File is not among Mann's papers at Baylor, and was probably left at the Department of State upon his resignation in 1966.

The collection also contains copies of Mann's public speeches during his service as Assistant Secretary of State for Economic Affairs, and copies of newspaper clippings which describe his earlier career.

The one unique item in the collection was donated to the Eisenhower Library by Ambassador Mann in January 1992. It is a section of his memoirs which contains comments on his work as Assistant Secretary of State for Economic Affairs during the Eisenhower administration. The comments are very general in nature but include some clues on the major issues and personalities with which Mann was involved at the time.
