4. Papers relating to my family or private business affairs, and papers relating to the families or private business affairs of persons who have had correspondence with me.
5. Papers containing statements about individuals which might be used to injure or harass them or members of their families.
6. Such other individual files as I, or my representative, or the Administrator of General Services may specify.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection has been arranged into two series. The first series consists of transcripts of White House press and radio conferences conducted by James Hagerty, press secretary to the President, or members of his staff. These date from January 21, 1953 through January 19, 1961. The second series consists of press releases issued by the Eisenhower campaign headquarters and by the White House press office. These press releases date from June 6, 1953 through December 16, 1960. Each series is arranged chronologically.

Subjects in both include speeches, statements and proclamations by the President Eisenhower and other high-ranking government officials; reports on Congressional actions and the status of legislation; announcements on official visits by heads of state; the President's illnesses; trips made by the President; summit conferences; and foreign affairs.

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
