The papers of Marie McCrum consist of correspondence between Mrs. McCrum and President Eisenhower, C.D. Jackson, other government officials, and her family. The papers relate primarily to Ms. McCrum's work with Mr. C. D. Jackson at the White House.

Literary property rights in these papers were assigned to the United States of America in the gift of papers.

By agreement with the donor, the following classes of documents will be withheld from research use, until the passage of time or other circumstances no longer require such restrictions:

- 1) Papers and other historical materials the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy of a living person.
- 2) Papers and other historical materials that are specifically authorized under criteria established by statute or Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy, and are in fact properly classified pursuant to such statute or Executive order.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The papers of Marie McCrum span the years 1952-1984. Ms. McCrum was a secretary to Mr. Charles Douglas (C.D.) Jackson from 1946-1964. During this time span, Mr. Jackson held several positions:

- 1) Executive with Time, Inc., 1931-1964
- 2) President, Free Europe Committee, 1951-1952
- 3) Speechwriter for General Dwight D. Eisenhower at Eisenhower Campaign Headquarters, 1952
- 4) Special Assistant to the President for International Affairs, 1953-1954
- 5) Speechwriter and consultant to the President, 1958

The papers consist mostly of social correspondence with Ms. McCrum's family, friends and government officials regarding her work with Mr. Jackson at the White House.
