The papers of Frank D. Newbury, Engineer, Vice-President and Director of Westinghouse Electric Corporation, and Assistant Secretary of Defense, were deposited in the Eisenhower Library in November, 1969, by his son, Paul L. Newbury. In October, 1969, Mr. Paul L. Newbury executed an instrument of gift for these papers.

Literary rights in the unpublished writings of Frank D. Newbury in these papers and in other collections of papers in the Eisenhower Library are reserved to Mr. Paul L. Newbury during his lifetime and there after, to the people of the United States.

By agreement with the donor the following classes of documents will be withheld from research use:

- 1. Papers relating to the family and private business affairs.
- 2. Papers relating to the family and private business affairs of other persons who have had correspondence with Frank D. Newbury
- 3. Papers relating to investigations of individuals or to appointments and personnel matters
- 4. Papers containing statements made by or to Frank D. Newbury in confidence unless in the judgment of the Director of the Dwight D. Eisenhower Library the reason for the confidentiality no longer exists.
- 5. All other papers which contain information or statements that might be used to injure, harass, or damage any living person.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The papers of Frank D. Newbury span the years 1896 to 1965 and consist of Brooklyn Manual Training High School and Cornell University mementos, clippings pertaining to his Westinghouse, Department of Defense, and Chautauqua Foundation affiliations, drafts of his own writings, and scrapbooks containing photographs, clippings, programs, invitations, and letters.

These papers are divided into six series, each series being of approximately equal length, and are arranged in chronological order. The first series pertains to Mr. Newbury's personal life: family, schooling, travel and associations. The second series concern his career with Westinghouse Electric Company and includes reports on company organization, profit-sharing and insurance plans, clippings, and mementos. The third series concern his career with the Department of Defense and consists of his appointments, some correspondence, speeches, newsclippings, Congressional testimonies, and resignation. The fourth series covers Mr. Newbury's affiliation with the Chautauqua Foundation. The fifth series concerns Mr. Newbury's writings, including a typescript and a handwritten draft of "The American System of Private Capitalism—Principles and Practices" (unpublished), and a condensed draft of "Common Sense Economics." The sixth series consists of four scrapbooks containing clippings, invitations, photographs, greeting cards, programs, etc., covering the years 1953-1957

Correspondence within this file is not numerous and generally routine in nature. There are several letters from high government officials, including President Eisenhower, on the occasion of Mr. Newbury's retirement from the Department of Defense.

Six photographs, 40 printed items, and 11 models received with the collection were separated and transferred to the Audio-visual and book collections of the Eisenhower Library and to the Eisenhower Museum.
