The papers of Charles I. Schottland were deposited in the Eisenhower Library by his grandson Mark Schottland in 1995 and 1996.

Mark Schottland signed an instrument of gift for the papers on October 15, 1995. Literary rights in the writings of Charles I. Schottland in this collection and in all other collections of papers received by the National Archives have been donated to the public. Under terms of the instrument of gift, the following classes of items are withheld from research use:

- 1. Papers which constitute an invasion of personal privacy or a libel of a living person.
- 2. Papers which are required to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy, and are properly classified.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Charles Irwin Schottland (1906-1995) was an expert on social welfare programs, and Commissioner of Social Security during the Eisenhower administration. He was born in Chicago, Illinois, and grew up in California. He attended the University of California at Los Angeles, and did graduate work at the New York School of Social Work and the UCLA Law School. During the 1930s he served as director of a number of social welfare organizations in California, including the Modern Social Center in Los Angeles, the California Relief Administration, and the Federation of Jewish Welfare Organizations.

During World War II Schottland served in the army in Europe and helped coordinate the relocation of millions of displaced persons. In this capacity he worked closely with the civil affairs division of Dwight D. Eisenhower's headquarters, and with the United Nations. After the war he practiced law in Los Angeles until 1950 when Governor Earl Warren appointed him director of the California state department of social welfare. He served in this position until 1954 when he was appointed Social Security Commissioner by President Eisenhower.

In 1958 Schottland resigned from government service to join the staff of Brandeis University in Massachusetts. He served as dean of the Florence Heller Graduate School for Advanced Studies in Social Welfare at the university, and was president of the university temporarily from 1970 to 1972. In 1979 he retired and moved to Tucson, Arizona, where he spent the rest of his life. Even in retirement he remained active in social welfare matters. He served as an advisor to the governor of Arizona, and headed the Arizona delegation to the White House Conference on Aging in December 1981.

The bulk of the papers of Charles Schottland were donated to Brandeis University. The collection at the Eisenhower Library consists primarily of articles, speeches, and newspaper clippings relating to the public aspects of his career. This collection has been divided into three series. The first series consists of printed articles and reports. Most of the items were written by Charles Schottland, although a few items were produced by agencies or committees with which he was associated. Individual publications and reports are filed first in chronological order. These are followed by two bound volumes containing copies of significant articles by Schottland. These are followed by the contents of three loose-leaf notebooks containing additional articles by Schottland. The notebooks were compiled by Schottland's staff. Each article was numbered sequentially and a list of the articles was placed in the front of each notebook. A few articles were missing when the collection was received at the Eisenhower Library.

The second series consists of information on Schottland's public speeches. The speeches were numbered sequentially by Schottland's staff and filed chronologically in loose-leaf notebooks. Transcripts are present for many of the speeches. However, in a few cases there are only handwritten outlines from which Schottland read, or brief notes saying no transcript was prepared. There are also gaps in the sequence, which indicates not all of the speeches were received at the Eisenhower Library.

The third series consists of newspaper clippings pertaining to Schottland's career. Most of the clippings cover his work as director of the California state department of social welfare, and at Brandeis University. Miscellaneous clippings and a few items of memorabilia are filed at the end of the collection.

Scrapbooks of newspaper clippings collected by Schottland and his staff, with a few loose clippings and memorabilia filed at the end of the series; most of the material covers 1950-54 and 1958-80.
