Spencer A. Townsend graduated from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1916. He was assigned to the American Occupation Forces in Germany, 1919-1927; was an instructor in the Organized Reserved in Los Angeles, California, 1935-1939; was assigned to Inspector General duties, 1940-1947; and retired from the U.S. Army in 1947.

The personal collection consists of memoranda, notes, diagrams, blue prints, manuals, newspaper clippings, dance cards from the U.S. Military Academy and menus. Subjects include the autofretting of gun muzzles, gun construction, U.S. Army physical training and interior guard training and an exercise in field.
