DESCRIPTION: Interview #1. Comments re his first meeting with John Foster Dulles; Dulles' views on collective security; Dulles' early interest in foreign affairs and the office of Secretary of State; consideration of Dulles for Chief Justice of Supreme Court; his appointment of Dulles as Secretary of State; his meeting with General MacArthur concerning Korea shortly after his election as President in 1952; Senator McCarthy's attacks on State Department personnel; discussions of foreign affairs aboard the Helena following the 1952 election; format of Cabinet meetings and NSC meetings; George Humphrey's relations with Dulles; Bricker amendment; Formosa and the China Straits; Formosa Resolution of 1955; the Open Skies proposal; U-2 flights; atomic retaliation; congressional support of the administration's foreign policy; and comments concerning a general assessment of John Foster Dulles as Secretary of State.
