Detailed comments on events during the first months when Central High School was desegregated in 1957: September 3--first day of school, and arrival of the National Guard; September 23--removal of the National Guard, and racial incidents in the school; arrival of federal troops--101st Airborne; harassment of students, and threats of violence by segregationists; work of the federalized National Guard; assessment of position of J.W.
