Fred Seaton and Arctic Wildlife Range

There is considerable, but widely scattered information in the Fred Seaton Papers on the Arctic Wildlife Range and related public land, oil leasing and mineral rights issues. Detailed research is needed to sort this out. Seaton may very well have done behind the scenes deal making with Rasmussen and others in Alaska since he pushed Alaskan statehood so hard and received pressure from developers and conservationists alike. In December, 1960, Seaton administratively established a 9,000,000 acre Arctic Wildlife Range, apparently after Congress failed to enact proposed legislation on this land with provisions dealing with mining and oil leasing. The Alaskan Congressional delegation apparently opposed this proposed legislation.

It appears that the Interior Department's policy on this Arctic Wildlife Range and the remainder of the land covered by PLO 82 was set by November 1957 and probably before that. Seaton went to Alaska in January 1957. A check of his papers covering this trip found no references to Rasmussen. We found only three items of correspondence between Elmer Rasmussen, President, National Bank of Alaska, Anchorage and Secretary Seaton. This correspondence, listed below, does not mention the Arctic Wildlife Refuge. Indicated that if Congress were unable to enact legislation then Secretary Seaton might have to reconsider decision to have mining entry permitted in Arctic Wildlife Range.
